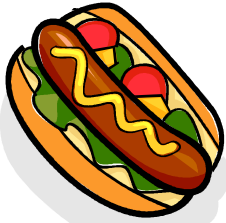

Wednesday, September 22, 2010

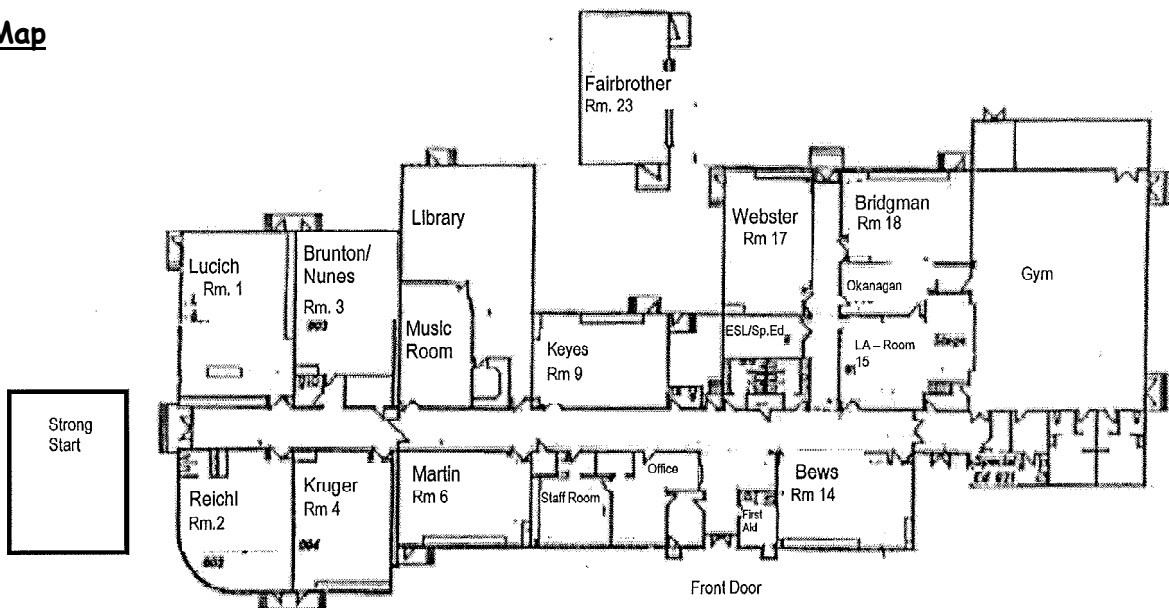
5:00 to 7:00 p.m.

As you are aware, Cawston School is on a boil water advisory. We have our own well, our water is regularly tested ( as per provincial regulations for schools), and at this time, we have been advised by Interior Health not to drink the water. We have been using bottled water since the advisory came into effect. Because we are a school with small children, our water safety standards are very stringent. The District is working diligently to rectify the problem. We will continue to use bottled water until Interior Health confirms that our water is perfectly safe for the children to drink.
